THE DR SURESH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM at Mullumbimby High School is due on 30 November. It is a \$500 scholarship for two indigenous and two non-indigenous students.

Dr Suresh was Mullumbimby Hospital's longest serving Visiting Medical Officer (VMO) and the town's only solo practitioner for many years. Dr Suresh Rananavare died of a heart attack at the age of 71 on Sunday 22 July 2012.

Dr Suresh's instructions in his will were to establish a scholarship to benefit students at Mullumbimby High School. The aim of the scholarships is to recognise and encourage student commitment to learning, active participation in the school community and provide students with financial support to enhance educational outcomes. Our school is very grateful for this scholarship and we encourage families to apply.

COVID-19 UPDATE AND CONTINUED COVID-SMART MEASURES

<u>NSW Health recently advised</u> that we are already starting to see a rise in COVID-19 transmissions within the community, with a peak of cases expected in early December. Our COVID-smart measures continue to be in place and are vital in allowing us to keep our schools operational while prioritising student and staff wellbeing. These measures include:

- staying home if unwell and/or showing any symptoms;
- mask-wearing strongly encouraged, particularly when indoors and/or when physical distancing is not possible, and on public transport;
- continued mandatory mask-wearing for anyone working with students at greater risk of serious illness whether they be in an SSP, support unit or mainstream classroom;
- using rapid antigen tests (RATs) when showing symptoms or exposed to COVID-19 (available at school);
- encouraging all students, staff and families to keep up-to-date with their vaccinations, including COVID-19 booster shots if eligible;

Predators & Apple Music Profiles: What Parents Need To Know

Earlier this month, Safe On Social, our online safety consultants, notified us about a new way that predators are targeting children - this time through Apple Music iTunes profiles. They have written a comprehensive blog post we encourage all our parents to read here.

We did however want to highlight a few action steps so that parents can make sure they understand exactly how kids are communicating and what steps to take immediately to prevent issues from happening.

It's important to note that most of the communication is made by posting a message via the

playlist description on Apple Music. One user will tag another and write a message in the 'playlist

description' area. Once tagged the other user will replace the message with one of their own

and tag the original user. This process goes back and forth allowing a conversation to take place - see screenshot.

Steps To Take To Further Secure Apple Music

Apple Music allows people to find your profile and follow you, so they can keep track of what

you're listening to and access your shared playlists. Here's how to make your (or your


child's) profile private if you pay for a subscription you can choose who's able to access it:


- 1. Open the Apple Music app.
- 2. Tap Listen Now in the bottom-left corner of the page.
- 3. Select your profile in the top-left corner.
- 4. Tap on your profile name to view your profile.
- 5. Choose Edit.
- 6. Under Who Can Follow Your Activity, select People you approve.

Unfollow and block users

- · Go to your profile.
- Under Following or Followers, tap a person to go to their profile.
- On the right side of their profile, tap the More button
- Tap Unfollow to stop following them.
- Tap Block to block a user from seeing your profile. People that you block won't see your music or find your profile in Apple Music.

We continue to support these teachings and discussions around online safety in school through the Safe On Social's ESAFETYHQ School Program we have rolled out this year. We look forward to continuing to educate and help support our parents and carers in keeping our children safe online.
