GOING AWAY 5 DAYS OR MORE?

A reminder to our school community that the NSW DET requires that parents arrange holidays **DURING** school vacations. If your family holiday is during school time, you will need to inform the School Principal in advance and submit a permission to leave from the school.

An application for leave should be provided <u>at least</u> <u>two weeks</u> prior to departure.

Ask our office for an "Application for Leave" BEFORE the holiday.

All students arriving **late** (after 8.50am) should always sign themselves in at Student Services with a note or a phone call from parents explaining the reason for their lateness.

Requests for an **early** leavers note (before 3pm) from parents with a valid reason should be dropped/called in before 9:30am to Student Services. Leave passes will be handed to students at recess so they can leave the class for their appointment before the end of school.

Kindly support your student to organise all after school plans before school begins to allow them to be fully engaged in their school work without any interruptions.



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To the Northern Rivers community

This week I visited schools in the Northern Rivers to hear from principals, students, parents and teachers. Unfortunately, I was unable to visit every school impacted by the floods, however, the visit enabled me to gain a better understanding of the devastating impact of the floods on school communities.

Due to the unique challenges facing schools, students and families, we have established a Flood Support program, to collect detailed information about the impact of the floods on each student.

This includes specific information about each student, the progress they had made, and the impact on their work.

Our current priority is offering support and advice for performance exams, practical projects and submitted works/projects. We value the suggestions that school executives have proposed and will review these and endeavour to implement where feasible.

NESA is also looking to expand our support for schools in the area, for the benefit of students, teachers and principals.

While I understand it can be very challenging, I encourage students to continue learning, and where practical and safe, working on projects and submitted works and preparing for performance exams.

Motivation can be hard to muster and maintain in times like these but focussing on post-school goals may provide a sense of hope.

I would like to reassure you that we will continue to support schools and ensure there are processes in place to support HSC students.
