# **P&C** Notes

At our meeting last Monday night, we enjoyed hearing from the principal Greg Armstrong of the many activities and plans in progress for the school. One of the exciting initiatives that the P&C is happy to support, through a contribution to the costs, is the purchase of a laser cutter for the Technology and Applied Science (TAS) department. As the name suggests, laser cutters create patterns and designs by cutting into materials. A powerful laser beam is the source that melts, burns, or vaporizes the material. Essentially, laser cutting is a fabrication process that uses a thin, focused, laser beam to cut and etch materials into custom designs, patterns, and shapes as specified by a designer. We believe this will be a wonderful resource for students in TAS and possibly other curriculum areas giving a salient experience and skills development to the students applicable to where technology is progressing in the market place.

This week, the P&C is submitting a grant application with Department of Community and Justice (DCJ) to apply for funds to deliver training via two day workshops in deep listening. The workshops will help develop the skills and confidence of those participating in being able to support other community members, family or friends that have been affected by traumatic events. The fund was set up to support organisations to deliver services to communities that had been affected by the floods in March this year. Our P&C is eligible to apply and we will be hopeful to offer the free, facilitated workshops to any interested persons from our school or broader local community if our application is successful. We will find out towards the end of this month and let you know how to register for workshops once we have organised these.

Thank you to all those parents that have helped the school library with covering the many new books that have been purchased for the students. There will be more books needing covering over the next month so if you have the time and desire to help out, please get in touch with the library staff or the P&C on the details below.


Next P&C Meeting on Monday 29st August from 6pm will be via zoom and you are invited and encouraged to join us.
