We are looking forward to welcoming all prospective new parents and students from surrounding primary schools at Mullumbimby High School on Tuesday afternoon and evening as part of our Year 6 into 7 Transition Program. There will be a school tour and an information session. This coming Saturday also at 9:30am, there will be an extra opportunity to visit with a one-hour walk-through of the school for any parent or student who could not make this Tuesday afternoon

We thank our Deputy Principal, Kelly Spilstead, and our transition coordinator Aaron Madritsch for their work to ensure that all students in Year 6 who are planning to come to Mullumbimby High School in 2024 have an exciting and enriching smooth transition process. Mr Madritsch will become their Year 7 Adviser in 2024.

NAPLAN tests took place for Year 7 and 9 students last week and our team of staff coordinating these tests did a great job to ensure students had the best possible opportunity to do their best.

Remediation and betterment work continues to take place at Mullumbimby High School. Currently, all roofs are being replaced and new gutters with downpipes and improved drainage are being created. In addition, we have every classroom in the school being painted over and four new air conditioning units are getting installed into classrooms this week. This has resulted in some room changes due to these works.

We have noticed a resurgence of some interesting foot ware which is not safe for school. If families could please support their young people to ensure they are wearing appropriate and safe footwear to school, in line with the below policies, it would be greatly appreciated. Students who attend school in unsafe or inappropriate clothing, includ-
