CAREERS UPDATE

WORK EXPERIENCE Year 10 students

In lieu of the snow trip in Week 3, Term 3, we support and encourage our Year 10 students to attend work experience for the week commencing Monday 31 July to Friday 4 August 2023.

Documentation will be distributed this week and we request that placements are finalised by end of Term 2. The Work Experience documents include a letter to the employer, plus Work Experience Guide and a letter to parent/carer and student outlining the process.

There is one form - the Student Placement Record - that the host employer will outline the tasks involved for the work experience and sign. This form is then signed by parent/carer and student and returned to the Careers Adviser for final approval prior to placement.
